• Securing Our Future - Safety Grant (Proposal - Action II)

Phase I - Application - 5-core areas of acceptable use for this grant project

- Access Control for School Properties
- Public Access / Visitor Control
- Fire Alarm Systems
- Surveillance
- Communications

Our initial request - Access Control and safety for our elementary schools. The existing elementary schools main access doors were designed decades ago without any security devices or even a visual line-of-sight of the front doors from the main office area. Anyone is able to enter, and walk through the building without notice, unless someone is posted at the front door. Again, we have sought out bids to remodel and place our front office area at the front door with window access to all visitors. We have also sought bids for a door entry camera system, as well as other options. This grant opportunity specifically mentioned - Access Control for School Properties, Facilities or interior Spaces.



Phase II - Additional support for schools that are not able to complete Major Projects without additional funding

Our Secondary Request: Rimrock Jr./Sr. High School's Evacuation/Fire alarm system is old, outdated in terms of repair, and unreliable. We have two seperate areas (classrooms) in which the alarm may not sound when conducting an evacuation drill. In response, we have sought out and received two separate bids to have a new alarm system installed in the building. The cost for a new evacuation/fire alarm system is above and beyond the current budgetary limits for our district to handle in one expenditure. Our options are to run a levy (which takes time and leaves us without a reliable system), or seek help through various grants. This grant opportunity specifically mentioned Life Safety (Fire Alarm) Systems.

Project Updates -

Duplex conversion: Mr. McClure met with Stacy Buckingham and the Architect. Measurements were taken. They discussed bearing walls and best plan solutions in order to get two apartments out of the unit. The architect fees will be approximately \$ 5,400.

Plans should be available in 2-weeks. Once plans are secured and approved. Mr. McClure and Mr. Blaser will seek bids through Policy 307.2 (Bids and Contracts procedures)

Housing Survey - A simple survey is being sent out to all who occupy district housing. The questionnaire will address concerns the occupants may have about any maintenance and/or repair needed.

Project Updates - Breezeway fence - Our maintenance team purchased materials and installed the fence and gate, saving the maintenance budget costs of approximately \$9,213.00 - the bid estimate to have been contracted and installed.
