FOUR DAY WEEK:

Students in the Bruneau-Grand View School District will attend school MONDAY through THURSDAY ONLY.

Bruneau & Grand View Elementaries start time is 8:00 a.m. (breakfast served 7:35- 7:50) & end time is 3:50 p.m.

Rimrock Jr/Sr High School start time is 7:55 a.m. (warning bell at 7:50 a.m.) & end time is 3:40 p.m.

The cafeterias will be open for lunch. K-12 Breakfast is free and Lunch fees will be \$3.30. Non enrolled students -\$3.30 Adults \$4.35 **All checks for school lunch should be separate from other school fees and lunch checks should be payable to JOINT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 365. Application will be on our website for free and reduced**

A Breakfast Program will be offered this school year, free to all enrolled students, starting the first day of school.

A Lunch Program will be offered this school year, free to all enrolled students, starting the first day of school.

Any student **NEW** to District No. 365 in grades K-12 is requested to pre-register at Bruneau Elementary, Grand View Elementary or Rimrock Jr/Sr High School after August 8th 2022, between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. **PROOF OF IMMUNIZATIONS AND BIRTH CERTIFICATE ARE REQUIRED UPON ENROLLMENT.** Sixth graders, who have been in our district as 5th graders, **do not** need to pre-register.

Parents of elementary students new to the district are requested to pre-enroll their students at the elementary school which serves their attendance area.

Kindergarten:

The kindergarten schedule, for the 2022-2023 school year, will be the same as regular school, all day/everyday. Please call Bruneau Elementary (845-2492) or Grand View Elementary School Office (834-2775) if you have any questions.

Immunizations and Birth Certificates:

Students entering kindergarten or the first grade, who did not attend kindergarten, **must** have a **birth certificate and immunization records at the time of registration.**

Rules and regulations of the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, according to Idaho Code Section 39-4801, require that proof of immunization against certain childhood diseases be presented for children attending **PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE TWELVE (12)** of any public, private or parochial schools in Idaho. Parents must bring proof of immunization at the time of registration or, if they choose to exempt their child from the state school immunization requirements for medical, religious, and/or other grounds, submit a signed certificate or signed statement as outlined in Idaho Code Section 39-4802.

According to Idaho Code 33-201 for a child who did not attend kindergarten, “school age” to enter the first grade shall be six (6) if this age has been reached on or before September 1. For a child who attends kindergarten “school age” shall be five (5) if this age has been reached on or before September 1.

Guardianship: The Board of Trustees requires that a student wishing to enroll in school who is residing with someone other than his/her parents must submit to the principal of the school, a legal document showing that the person with whom he/she is residing assumes legal responsibility for the attending student.

Bus Routes: Buses will continue to run the same routes as in May, 2021. If for any reason a route is modified from last year, notification will be made as soon as a new schedule is determined.

Insurance: THE SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES NOT PROVIDE MEDICAL INSURANCE TO AUTOMATICALLY PAY FOR MEDICAL EXPENSES WHEN STUDENTS ARE INJURED AT SCHOOL.

High School Fall Sports (football/volleyball/cross country) will begin practice on Monday, August 9th.

ALL ATHLETES must have signed paperwork and physicals on file the first day of practice.

NO EXCEPTIONS.

Athletes will not be allowed to participate in practices or competitions until all signed paperwork and physicals are returned. **Paperwork can be printed from the school website, or picked up at the Rimrock office.**

If entering the 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th or 11th grade, each athlete is required to have a new physical, obtained after May 15 of this year, on file at Rimrock prior to his/her participation in any sport. 10th and 12th grade athletes who already have a valid physical form on file must have the yearly consent form completed by their parents.

Desert Sage Health Centers are providing **FREE** sports physicals July 2 through September 15. Call your Desert Sage Health Center to book an appointment. Please call as soon as possible so students have their physical before the first day of practice. Students waiting until the last minute may not be able to get in for an appointment in time to start the sports season.

Desert Sage Health Center will also be providing FREE sports physicals from their mobile clinic at Rimrock on Wednesday, August 3rd. Please call the Rimrock office to schedule your appointment-208-834-2260. Athletes must have their physical form signed by a parent when they arrive for their physical. School Directory: Each year a student directory is published listing the student’s name, grade level, parents’ names, address and telephone number. The directory is used by school district personnel for mailing, etc.

The notices for the directory will be distributed to the students along with an authorization form for a signature authorizing the school district’s schools to release student information for public relations; such as, athletic events, honor rolls, student organizations, official school or district functions, speech, drama, musical events and other similar kinds of activities. This information could be used on the school district website as well as for newsletters, newspaper articles, T.V. and radio publications.

If a parent does not want his/her child’s name in the directory or used for public relation purposes, the school district must have a letter on file stating the parent’s request by September 1, 2022.

Parents Access to Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, enacted as part of the educational Amendment of 1974, P.L. 93-380, establishes the rights of parents, guardians, or eligible students to have access to their children's school records and limits the disclosure of personally identifiable information from school records without consent of the parent, guardian, or eligible student to:

- A. Other school officials, including teachers, within the district who have a legitimate educational interest.
- B. Officials of other schools in which the student intends to enroll; however, parents will be informed of the transfer, receive a copy of the record, if requested, and have an opportunity for a hearing to challenge the content of the record(s), if requested.
- C. Authorized representatives of: Comptroller General of the United States, Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health Education and Welfare and State education authorities, provided that access to student records is necessary in connection with the audit and evaluation of a federally supported program or for the enforcement of federal legal requirements in connection with such a program and that unless specifically authorized by federal law, no information is included which would permit the personal identification of students or their parents after the data has been collected.
- D. Such persons as necessary in connection with a student's application for, or receipt of, financial aid.
- E. In compliance with judicial order or orders of administrative agencies where those agencies have the power of subpoena. Parents(s) guardian(s), or eligible student(s) will be notified of all such orders and the school's compliance with same.

Bruneau-Grand View School District No. 365 will make available for inspection school records to parent(s), guardian(s), or eligible student(s) complying with the following procedures:

1. Notify the school(s) involved that you wish to inspect student records;
2. Make an appointment for inspection;
3. Complete and sign the Request to Inspect School Records form. When the eligibility of the person(s) initiating a request to inspect individual student records has been verified, the school will make the records available for inspection.

School records are interpreted to include, but not necessarily limited to, identifying data, academic work completed, level of achievement, attendance data, scores on standardized intelligence, aptitude, and psychological tests, interest inventory results, health data, family background information, teacher/counselor ratings and observations and certified reports of serious or recurrent behavior patterns. All of these school records are available for inspection by eligible persons. If there are records of individual testing in the district, the person(s) inspecting the records will be informed of the location and procedure for inspecting these records.

All personally identifiable student information no longer needed by the district will be destroyed.
